Fatima Sadiqi is a Senior Professor of linguistics and Gender Studies at the University of Fes, Morocco. She has published extensively on Moroccan languages and women/gender issues in Morocco including Images of Women in Abdullah Bashrahil's Poetry (2004) (Arab Institute for Research and Publishing, 2003), Women, Gender and Language in Morocco (Brill, 2003), and Grammaire du Berbère (L'Harmattan, 1997).
